#### **12 CLERK PAYROLL**

Councillors **RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY** to employ SME Accounting Ltd to carry out the Clerk's payroll.

#### **13 PARISH COUNCIL LAPTOP**

Cllr. Rob Crispin had retrieved the data from the old laptop when it stopped functioning. Cllr. Sarah Hutchison had been gifted a laptop for the Parish Council by a local IT company. The Clerk agreed to review the laptop and software and report back at the June meeting. Thanks were given to Cllr. Rob Crispin for rescuing the data from the old laptop and to Cllr. Hutchison for sourcing a laptop.

Online document storage using, for example, Microsoft 365 was discussed briefly and would be considered further at the June meeting.

#### **14 OARE DOG WASTE BIN COLLECTION**

The new West Berkshire Council (WBC) contractors had not collected waste from the Oare bin since February, when they had taken on the contract. Despite several requests, WBC had not collected the waste. Following complaints from Hermitage parishioners that the bin was overflowing, the Clerk had arranged for Tactical Facilities Management Ltd (TFM Ltd) to empty it.

Previously, Triangle Management had been contracted to collect the waste. The Parish Council moved to WBC contractors because the service was cheaper. The Clerk confirmed that TFM Ltd was cheaper than WBC. Councillors **RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY** to employ TFM Ltd to carry out the waste collection in Oare.

Cllr. David Cowan requested information on the disposal of the collected waste to ensure the correct procedures were being followed. The Clerk would request this information.

**ACTION: Clerk**

## 15 OLD PROW NOTICEBOARD IN CURRIDGE

The old noticeboard would be removed from outside the WI Hall and deleted from the Asset Register. The Clerk would investigate the cost of removal and report back to Council. **ACTION: Clerk**

## 16 ASSET REGISTER

The Asset Register was approved and adopted for the forthcoming year (Appendix 4)

## 17 CLERK REPORT

- **Chieveley – narrowed white lines between end of Graces Lane and School Road.** Following a request by the Parish Council to reinstate the narrowed lines, WBC had carried out an inspection and concluded that no further action was required. Without evidence to explain WBC's original decision to paint the narrowed lines, the Parish Council could not challenge WBC's recent decision.

The footpath from the Red Lion to Sweetie Pie allowed pedestrians to avoid the road but the footpath sign in Green Lane had been obscured by foliage. Removal of foliage would be checked before the next meeting.

- The Clerk had not yet received detailed responses from WBC enforcement regarding the activities at **Curridge Green riding school and the removal of a listed building at The Limes, Chieveley.** **ACTION: Clerk**
- **Curridge – footpath from Planation Close to Crabtree Lane.** WBC had confirmed that work would start on 9 May and would take three weeks to complete. Traffic lights would be in place for the duration of the works. The work required the relocation of one telegraph pole. WBC was working with SSE to move the pole, but it meant that, for a short time, the path would be obstructed.
- **Speed Awareness Group (SAG) – Mr Alan Hall (05/05 email).** The Police had agreed several sites where speed checks could be carried out, and Gareth Dowding of Traffic and Road Safety, WBC, had approved locations for the required Community Speed Watch (CSW) signs. Mr Hall would collect the equipment from PC Lee Turnham, who managed the CSW campaign for Thames Valley Police. Volunteers for Chieveley were still needed – only Mr Hall and Cllr Sarah Hutchison had agreed to participate. Sufficient volunteers had been recruited for Curridge. The need for additional volunteers in Chieveley had been publicised locally and via the MyChieveley website.

SAG has requested approximately £1850 + VAT from the Parish Council for the CSW signage. The Clerk would seek further information about the request for consideration at the June meeting. **ACTION: Clerk**

**Speeding outside Chieveley School.** A resident complaining about traffic speeds along School Road had been advised to contact the SAG.

- **Chieveley Byway 33 access point.** An email (03/05) from a Rookery Farm resident to MP Laura Farris had been copied to the Parish Council. The resident had requested support to restrict access to the Byway to manage episodes of rural crime and excessive damage to crops.
- **Chieveley High Street - bus shelter down pipe.** The Parish Council thanked Mr Giles Derry for reattaching the down pipe to the bus shelter.

## **18 COUNCILLORS REPORTS**

### **Oare**

- Cllr. Sandie Allan reported that the travelling community in Hermitage had submitted a further planning application and suggested that CPC support Hermitage Parish Council (HPC), if needed. Cllr. Lesley Derry would attend the next HPC meeting and offer CPC support.
- Anti-social behaviour during the May Bank Holiday had resulted in the police being contacted. The police monitored all such reports and encouraged further incidents to be reported.
- There had been complaints about the traffic associated with Showground events. The Clerk would contact the Newbury and District Agricultural Society (NADAS) about the need for effective traffic management at its events. **ACTION: Clerk**
- Stable View continued to concern residents. A meeting with WBC some years ago had been unsatisfactory. It was agreed that a summary of all the correspondence and meetings with WBC and contact with the police would provide a useful history of the issues and could be used to revisit discussions with WBC. **ACTION: Clerk**

### **Curridge**

- Bluebell Stables had generated many complaints from residents concerned about the general state of the site and the dumping of waste. The Clerk would contact enforcement. **ACTION: Clerk**
- Cllr. Rob Crispin agreed to contact members of the Playground Trust to find out about progress of the installation of an irrigation system. **ACTION: Cllr. Rob Crispin**

### **Future projects**

Cllr. Lesley Derry asked that some historic and new projects that be discussed at future meetings. These included: Chieveley burial ground; PROW from East Lane (Chieveley) to the Recreation Ground; Stable View, Oare; involving the community, especially younger people; identifying project needs in Curridge; and data protection and email accounts.

# Chieveley Parish Council End of Year Report for 2022-2023

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As of 1 April 2022, the funds carried forward were £75,139.

As of 31 March 2023, the funds to be brought forward were £78,748 – an increase of 4.8%

Note: the increase at year-end 2022 (£75,139) was a 3% increase on the 2021 year end.

### INCOME

In 2022-23, income was £39,660, including £1,792 from the Recreation Centre.

Income, excluding the Recreation Centre payments, was £37,868

Forecast income for 2022-23 was £33,115. Actual income shows an increase of £4,571 over forecast.

Unexpected income included:

- £432 CIL payment. (Hillier Garden Centre
- £956 Member bid for the PROW Signage
- £3,044 VAT Refund
- Bank interest and Precept.

### EXPENDITURE

In 2022-23, expenditure was £36,051 against a forecast expenditure of £42,406.

CPC expenditure was £6,355 (15%) less than anticipated.
